1st Friday Prayer and Action Against the Death Penalty


We pray in gratitude that Governor Cooper of North Carolina commuted 15 death sentences to life without parole, and that President Biden commuted 37 death sentences.

14 Feasts of Sts. Cyril & Methodius we pray for the safety of Slavic people along the Russian Border.


Valentine's Day

Global World Tourism Day (UN) We pray for the safety and wellbeing of travelers.




Feast of St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara, CMI (first Saint of India) We pray for the Catholics of India.

Execution of Sophie and Hans Scholl, martyrs of the White Rose, for nonviolent resistance to the Nazis in 1943

23 W.E.B. Dubois, educator and civil rights activist, born in 1869 We pray for the end of racism.

> **Anniversary of the racially motivated killing of Ahmaud Arbery in Brunswick, Georgia in 2020** We pray for the end of racism.

24 Russia invades Ukraine in 2022 We pray for peace for the people of Ukraine and the people of Russia.















25 Herman Revels becomes first Black Senator in 1870 We pray for a Congress that seeks the common good.



26 Philippine People Power Day (1986 nonviolent change of a violent government in the Philippines) We pray for the people of the Philippines.

> Anniversary of the killing of Trayvon Martin, an unarmed Black teenager, in Sanford, Florida in 2012

> We pray for the end of racism and violence in our communities.

27 We pray for refugees, immigrants, and migrants, especially those at the U.S. southern border, living in the U.S., and in Gaza.



28 Ramadan begins We pray for the end of Islamophobia.
