






4 Feast of St. John Vianney Patron of Priests

We pray for all priests especially those in the Underground Church of China, in the Ukraine, Nicaragua and Nigeria





We pray with gratitude for those who served our country and that their service led to death or injury.


We pray for healing for those with lasting injuries and peace for loved ones


