International Day to End Immunity for Crimes Committed against Journalists (UN)


Theme: Safety of Journalists in Crises and emergencies

We pray for peace in the Ukraine and Russia


9–15 International Week of Science for Peace and Development (UN)

Theme: You are My Hope


We pray that we treat those who have been impoverished with love, dignity, & respect

International Day for Tolerance (UN)


We pray for the grace to be tolerant of those who are different from us and choose to be tolerant themselves, whether the difference International Day


