3 Feasts of St. Blaise and Our Lady of Suyapa (Honduras)

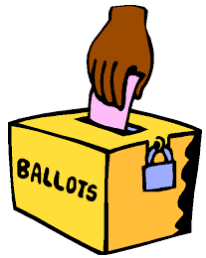
Feast of Servant of God Mary Elizabeth Lange, died in 1882; founder of the Oblate Sisters of Providence, the first African-American community in the USA.

International Day of Zero Tolerance of Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) (UN)

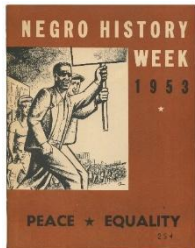
We pray for the people of Japan and for the 200 million victims of FGM.

International Day of Women and Girls in Science (UN)

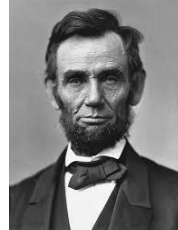
We pray for women scientists.

We pray for Kendrick Simpson, scheduled for execution in Oklahoma, for the victims, and for their families.

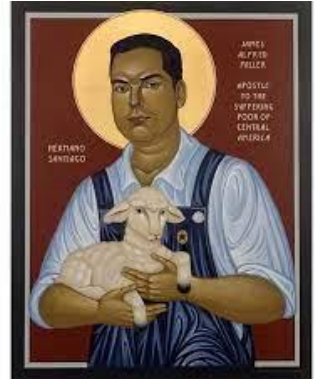


13 Brother James Miller, FSC, martyred in Guatemala in 1982

We pray for peace for the Slavic nations.

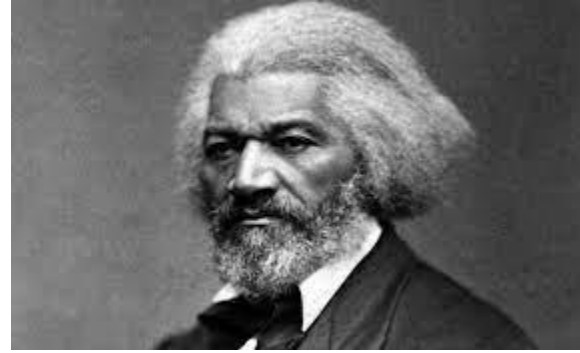
Stoneman Douglas High School Shootings in Parkland, FL (2018)

We pray for a blessed Lent.

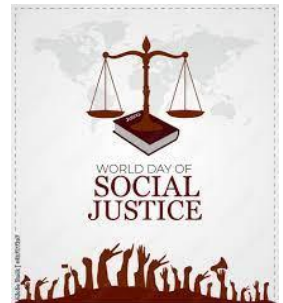


19 We pray for persecuted Christians, especially in Nicaragua, China, and Nigeria.

26 People Power Day (1986 nonviolent change from a violent government in the Philippines)

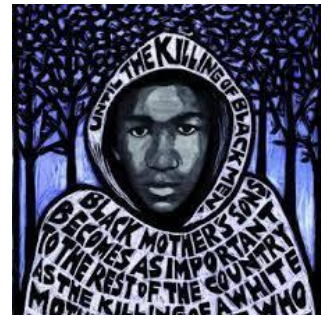
Corazon Aquino elected first woman president after nonviolent revolution.
